Use sunflowers for quick resource generation, incorporate lawn-mowers as a last line of defense, and deploy plants with area damage like Melon-pults. Also, keep a balanced mix of offensive and defensive plants to handle diverse zombie threats. How can I optimize my plant placement for maximum protection in challenging levels? Place defensive plants like Tall-nuts or Spikeweeds in strategic positions to block or damage zombies,

position offensive plants behind them for continuous attack, and adjust placements based on zombie attack patterns to maintain a strong defense.

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
